Program Description

The Title I program at Juniata Valley Elementary encourages all parents to be involved in their child's education. JVES will use the Parent and Family Engagement Policy to help increase communication and interaction among teachers and parents of students. Through this communication and various parent engagement meetings and activities, expectations can

Title I funds are used to compensate two Title I teachers and one paraprofessional. The targeted program at JVES focuses on reading intervention and instruction in grades K-3. JVES staff

will be responsible for providing parents with relevant information regarding intervention programs used, school curriculum, academic assessments, the school's progress, and the child's growth. Monthly newsletters (paper and email), website postings, flyers, and invitations to school events will be used to communicate information to families. If needed, information will be translated to additional languages for families.

We will provide parents and families of students who receive Title I services in the area of reading with progress reports. Title I teachers will collaborate with grade level teachers to monitor and communicate student progress. Title I teachers will also attend parent conferences, which are held in November. Parents may request additional meetings with staff members at any time.

Title I teachers and grade level teachers will participate in training focused on effective parent engagement strategies and will also collaborate with preschool providers to ensure a successful transition into kindergarten at JVES. These measures will promote positive family engagement early in a child's school career.

An annual meeting will be held each year, once at kindergarten orientation and another scheduled early in the year for parents of students at other grade levels. Parents will be invited annually to evaluate the effectiveness of the Title I program and its policies, and are encouraged to make suggestions for improvement. During this meeting, parents and families will be informed

about the requirements of the Title I plan and their right to be involved in the planning of the Title I Consolidated Application. Parents may also receive information about the Title I program through Open House, parent conferences, and family reading events. The Title I School Level policy will be distributed to parents with the Home-School Compact and Title I permission form, which includes space for parent
